KEYNOTE SPEAKER: Dr Richard Harris OAM BMBS, DA (UK), FANZCA, Dip DHM, Post Grad Cert Aeromed



His passion for cave diving goes back to the 1980's and has taken him to the corners of the globe in search of new adventures. An interest in accident investigation, and search and rescue activities has been a theme during his diving and caving career.

Harry and his colleagues have explored caves to 245m depth, and shipwrecks to over 150m, in dives lasting over 16 hours. He is an enthusiastic UW photographer and videographer who is now also building a career in documentary films.

Many of you will know Harry best for the crucial role he played in the Tham Luang cave rescue in Thailand in 2018. He employed his extensive experience in cave diving with his anaesthetic knowledge and skill to successfully help rescue twelve trapped children and their soccer coach.

For the last 22 years Andy has been a Commando Intensive Care Paramedic in the UK and a National Inter-agency Liaison Officer (NILO). At 17 years old he became a Royal Marines Commando followed by six operational tours of Iraq and Afghanistan, six extended trips to Borneo, has worked in six of the seven continents of the world. Andy is an Australian representative for the Faculty of Pre-hospital Care Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (FPHC RCSEd) and has completed the London Air Ambulance Pre-Hospital Care Course. He is also an Editor for the Journal of High Threat and Austere Medicine, a casual instructor with Tacmed Australia and Faculty for the World Extreme Medicine (WEM) jungle medicine course run out of Costa Rica.

Scott McNamara Intensive Care Paramedic Dr Rowena Christiansen practises in pre-hospital emergency care and medicine in extreme and austere environments, with a focus on space health. She teaches within the University of Melbourne Medical School and has developed a new MD1 'Discovery Subject' "Human health in the space environment", and a module on 'humans in space' for Swinburne University of Technology. Her post-graduate studies include emergency and critical care, aerospace medicine, disaster management, child health, and space studies, with earlier qualifications in business, law, humanities, and education.

Rowena is a UNOOSA Space4Women Mentor, an ISU alumna and mentor, and a Fellow of Ormond College. She is the Research Director, Health Law for the Jus Ad Astra human rights in space project, and a strong human rights advocate, particularly in the area of public health and universal access to healthcare. Rowena is also a Director of Mars Society Australia, Chair of the Australian Ski Patrol Association Medical Advisory Committee, the inaugural Treasurer for the Australasian Wilderness and Expedition Medicine Society, and a representative member for the Australian Resuscitation Council.

Over 30 years with NSW Ambulance (NSWA). Member of the Special Casualty Access Team (Remote Area Access) based in the Blue Mountains since 1999 responding to patients in wilderness and remote area environments. This includes 10 years experience on NSWA rescue medical helicopters as a flight paramedic. Starting with the Australian Army at 17 he became a Special Operations Medic and was deployed to Timor Leste and Afghanistan, now working for NSW Ambulance as an Intensive Care Special Operations and Rescue Paramedic in Sydney. Scott has been with deployed internationally to Sumatra, Lombok and Türkiye for disaster assistance and is part of the USAR Paramedic Aus 2 team.

She combines this love with psychology and specialises in highperformance coaching, research, and consulting on mental health risk in wilderness activities and austere settings.

Kate also provides mental health trauma care to victims of disaster and conflict, both in Australia and internationally. Kate is the former Head Psychologist at the NRL, and currently works with Fire and Rescue NSW developing and facilitating Wellness Retreats for first responders with PTSD; and well as continuing to build on her work with Psychological First Aid and Mental Health training in remote, austere and wilderness environments.

Ben Fisk is an Intensive Care Flight Paramedic. He grew up in Southwest Victoria and feels incredibly lucky to have returned to the area 20 years later to work at one of Victoria's HEMS bases. Ben enjoys all things outdoors related and particularly enjoy ocean swimming. He is currently learning all about how to manage sheep, lambs, chooks, and an energetic Kelpie.

He has an interest in research and education, previously completing a PhD and is currently an ongoing associate lecturer at Monash University. His career highlights include achieving all of the requirements to work as an Intensive Care Flight Paramedic which was the realisation of a career-long goal. And his most rewarding experience so far has been delivering BLS training for local medical staff at a remote clinic in Timor Leste. While Ben enjoyed his PhD, he is not quite ready to transition to full time academia, however he believes that research and contemporary clinical practice are complimentary. He is particularly interested in how teams work, how we make decisions, and how best to teach complex problem-solving skills.

Chris Gallagher is a former carpenter turned Field Support and Emergency Management Coordinator and Senior Field Training Officer with the Australian Antarctic Program, who he has worked with for 28 years. Gavin Oliver Special Operations Paramedic



Dr Daniel Lack MBBS, PhD, FRACGP Before becoming a paramedic, Gavin worked in the outdoors industry for 17 years, blending his passion for climbing, exploring the wilderness, and helping people. Gavin found himself performing several on-rope rescues by the time he was 21. Over the next 30 years, while climbing through 13 countries on five continents, he was regularly finding himself as the 'right person in the right place at the right time', using his experience to assist people whose adventures were taking an unexpected turn. His first-aid kit kept expanding, though he was never using it for himself.

After a brief stint working for the U.N. in Afghanistan, he returned to Australia to focus on a long-held desire of working in wilderness rescue. He has been a paramedic with NSW Ambulance for 10 years and part of their Special Operations Team for the past four. Paramedics in this unit are trained to access and treat patients in isolated, remote, and hazardous environments. They respond in 4WD vehicles equipped for responses to patients on the cliffside, in remote bushland, floods, swift water and bushfires, along with tactical, HAZMAT and CRBN environments. He has lived in the Blue Mountains for 20 years, is still climbing first ascents and loves exploring the magic of the Blueys with his family.

Before entering the medical field, Dan had a 20-year career in climate change research that coincided with over a decade of working for one of the busiest mountain rescue teams in the US. During this research career he won two awards from the University of Colorado for his work on climate change, and he served on delegations to the UN International Maritime Organisation for progression of climate change policy for international shipping. In his mountain rescue career Dan responded to over 600 mountain search and rescues with the Rocky Mountain Rescue Group. He became a technical field leader, mission leader, training director and assistant group leader. He also served a term as the chairperson for the Rocky Mountain Region of the US Mountain Rescue Association. Through this work he helped coordinate a mass rescue during a flooding disaster in 2013 and received a US National Association for Search and Rescue Valour award in 2010.

This rescue experience pushed him to study medicine, and he now integrates these passions in expedition and wilderness medicine. He especially enjoys delving into psychology as a tool for being safer in the wilderness and providing care to people in wild places. He also has a keen interest in conservation, both through his previous career, and more recently through advocacy for preservation of a large tract of land in the mountains of Tasmania.

Currently Dan holds positions as the medical director of the Ben Lomond Ski Patrol, Tasmania, member of the medical advisory committee for the Australian Ski Patrol Association, lead instructor for UTAS Expedition Medicine course, medical director for a Tasmanian event medical company and an Australian based African travel company, and head medical for the takayna Trail Ultra.

Steve 'Sunny' Whitfield Bachelor of Paramedic Practice, GradCertPubHlth, GradCertULT, GradDip Strategic Leadership Steve 'Sunny' Whitfield is an Australian-based paramedic, expedition leader, consultant and writer who got involved in expeditions when he realised he could escape back-to-back night shift. A former soldier with several conflict zone deployments, Sunny's first expedition was nearly his last when he nearly froze to death in the arctic. Now a veteran of over 50 expeditions including polar exploration, jungle journeys, desert crossings, mega-fauna diving, and high altitude climbing, his work and travels have taken him to almost 90 countries.

Although he struggles to spell, Sunny has authored two books and published over forty articles and during his career, he has been awarded Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, Fellow of the Academy of Wilderness Medicine, Fellow of the Higher Education Academy, and Fellow of the Australasian College of Paramedicine. In 2020, he established Explora Risk Medical to provide medical solutions for teams from National Geographic, Discovery+ and Natural History. Explora recently launched an Australian based Expedition Medicine CPD Series and soon, it will launch Australia's first clinical fellowship in extreme environment medicine. Sunny is a father of four who now resides on the Gold Coast where he is a lecturer and course convenor at Griffith University School of Medicine and Dentistry.

Dr Liv Grover-Johnson is well known to AWEMS, being one of our committee members! She has always had an insatiable appetite for remote areas: the further away from anywhere else the better! Her university years were more of an education in the outdoors, with a bit of medical school on the side. Liv lived in a tent in Svalbard for two months, went mountaineering in NZ, rock-climbing, diving, sailing and backcountry ski-touring. It was necessary to sharpen her focus on medicine for several years as an intern and resident, but recently she has been able to start weaving these passions together. The combination of medical training and these outdoors skills has begun to open opportunities as an expedition medic in the Simpson Desert, The Great Barrier Reef, Greenland, and even Antarctica! Liv is deeply interested in supporting scientists who are working in the deep-field for research projects - whether this is to better understand and protect our planet, ecosystems and its wild creatures, or to further our knowledge of human physiology when pushed to the extremes. Recently Liv achieved a life-long dream, working as an Antarctic Doctor at Casey Research Station in the Summer 22/23 season.

Liv is also a volunteer editor and the Australasian lead for Adventure Medic. Adventure Medic is a multi award-winning, free, online magazine for students and healthcare professionals across the globe interested in wilderness, expedition and humanitarian medicine.
